What to Bring:

- Pack light! You will be responsible for carrying your own luggage and we have limited space!
- Bring things such as AirPods, Books, cards, snacks to keep yourself entertained in the cars or any downtime at Festival!
- Bring a Photo ID even if all you have is a School ID, but a license or passport is best!
- Bring Cash just in case we stop for coffee or want to order some late night food at the hotel.
- Bring warm clothes...it's winter!
 - **Masks** are not required but are recommended at all times during the festival including during IEs/Scholarships!
 - Clothes you can move in- Many of the workshops involve some level of movement. Note: You won't be able to change clothes before workshops begin on Friday, so wear clothes you can move in during the car ride.
 - If you think you will want to take a dance class, you can bring any jazz or dance shoes you own. If you don't have dance shoes, but you still want to take a dance class, that's totally fine too.
- If you are doing a musical theater Thespy or a College Scholarship Audition: You are expected to supply your own music (Sheet music for Thespian, CD/pre-recorded for College with player). For all Thespys, you can have an instrumental soundtrack (no recorded lyrics) on your phone and play it through any type of speaker you may own. The Thespian Festival will not supply any speakers or CD players.
- Water bottle
- A small draw-string bag or backpack to carry your things in, is always helpful because of all the Vendor or university gear
- A pencil and maybe a notepad or journal to take notes
- **If you have a smartphone, please see the Eventsential link. Averi Rose will text it out once it goes live!** This is an extremely helpful online tool that contains your entire Thespian Festival schedule as well as a list of all the available workshops.
- **If you are participating in a Thespy, bring all black clothes! All Thespy participants must be dressed in black!**

- While the college representatives will view all of the students' applications on the getacceptd.com platform in the weeks leading up to Festival, not all students will be asked to perform again (live) while at the Festival. This does not mean they will not be offered scholarships though, it simply means that the college representatives think they have seen enough via the video submissions and application information already submitted that they can make their determination.
- Many students though may be asked to perform a live callback audition (if a performer) or a live presentation (if a stage manager or technician). Students should be prepared to perform/present if requested. Students and Parents may not watch any 'callbacks', however, the student's director(s) are allowed to watch.
 - Live callbacks will most likely take place on Friday evening.
- In addition, performance candidates will be able to attend an (optional) Dance Audition. This is not an audition though for students that wish to pursue just dance, it is intended for Actors and Musical Theatre Performers to highlight their dance skills. There is nothing to plan for this aspect. Any dance material will be taught on the spot.

General College Scholarship Information Continued

- During the Saturday of Festival weekend, some students will also be asked to meet with select schools for “**Final Interviews**”. These students will be notified while at the Festival a couple hours after the completion of all of the last scheduled ‘Callback’ of the day.. Final Interviews will take place at the information tables of the various colleges that are attending. Although it is suggested, students are not required to meet with all schools that call them for Final Interviews if they are not interested.

Thespian Scholarship General Information

- The Thespian scholarship is worth \$500 and is awarded to 10 Michigan Thespians
- All winners must use the grant for furthering their education with a major or minor in theatre and/or communication arts.
- Thespian scholarship auditions will take place on Saturday
- There will be no formal feedback (neither verbal nor written)

Thespian Scholarship: Performance Candidates	Thespian Scholarship: Technical Candidates
You will perform for 5 minutes. You can choose what you want to perform within that time (musical, non-musical, or both). You will be stopped once you reach the 5 minute time limit.	This category is for Stage Managers, designers, technicians, etc. Students in this category must create a video presentation of their portfolio of work. Stage Managers often present a prompt book. Designers/Technicians can use drawings, designs, or realized artifacts such as completed costumes if they want. Students will have up to (5) minutes to present.
If you are performing a song, you must bring sheet music for the accompanist to play. You may not bring a pre-recorded soundtrack. You must perform with live music. You will have the option to sign up for a rehearsal slot with the accompanist before your audition.	Bring your portfolio. It should illustrate your expertise in technical theatre/design or stage management.
Make sure you also bring your portfolio for the portfolio screening.	Be prepared to answer questions from judges.
After your performance, there will be an interview and portfolio screening for 5 minutes. During the interview, students are generally asked questions that will have them reflect on past experiences as well as future plans.	

What is a slate?

Your slate is how you formally introduce yourself at college auditions. It's recommended that you also use a formal slate if you are participating in a Thespy. Your slate should be memorized.

Here's the slate format:

"Hello. My name is _____ and I am from troupe 2258 from Dexter High School. I will be performing (insert title of piece) from (insert title of show) by (name of composer/writer)."

Note: If you are performing more than one piece, you must list all of them in your slate in this format.
